He joined Harvard University's Office of General Counsel in 1989, devoting a considerable portion of his time on a significant Department of Justice antitrust investigation involving admissions and financial aid. This work peaked his interest in the field, and he joined the Admissions and Financial Aid Office at Harvard University's Graduate School of Arts and Sciences (GSAS) in 1994. Here he was the Junior Admissions and Financial Aid Officer in the Social Sciences Division, becoming the Senior Admissions and Financial Aid Officer in the Humanities Division in 1995. In 1997, he joined the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid at Harvard Divinity School, where he held positions as Coordinator of Financial Aid and Associate Director of Financial Aid. From 2005-2015, Bob was the Director of Financial Aid at Harvard Medical School. In 2015, he became Director of Financial Aid at Wesleyan University, the position he currently holds.
